## A YEAR OF FUN, UNIQUE EXPERIENCES

- H.O.P.E. Walks: Throughout the program duration, a total of 6 H.O.P.E. Walks were successfully conducted. These walks served as inclusive, community-building activities, encouraging physical activity and connection with nature.
   Walks were held at Saluda Shoals Park, Falls Park, Hunting Island State Park, Henry C. Chambers Waterfront Park and Greenview Park.
- Park Excursions: Engaging excursions were organized to different South Carolina parks, exceeding the minimum requirement. These excursions aimed to provide participants with immersive experiences in diverse natural settings, fostering appreciation for South Carolina's parks.
  Program participants visited Hunting Island State Park, Saluda Shoals Park, Falls Park, Sesquicentennial State Park and Henry C. Chambers Waterfront Park.
- Participant Engagement: Each excursion greatly exceeded the minimum goal of 60 participants, indicating strong community interest and engagement in the program's offerings.
